Ocean County ARES® News



July 2023

During the June 21st Ocean County ARES meeting, I demonstrated a portable VARA FM station he built that could be used for a mobile application or at a deployment site such as a shelter. The case is nothing [Continued on next page]

OUR NEXT "REGULAR" MEETING:

Thursday July 6th at 7:00 PM Holiday City South Clubhouse A Santiago Drive at Mule Road Toms River, NJ fancy, just an outdated K40 Roadcase Plus that was sold years ago for truckers and CB radio. I had two brand new cases just sitting on the shelf and decided to finally put them to use.

The unit features an Alinco DR-135T digital 9600 baud transceiver, Masters Communications DRA-30 sound module and a Lenovo Thinkcentere micro PC running Windows 10. The case connections were located to make it easier to position the unit on the back seat of my mobile. The PC was designed to run off a 20 VDC power pack with 120 VAC input, but I found a DC supply made by PWR+ that will do the job nicely with 12 to 24 VDC input. The cigar plug was cut off and a 30 amp powerpole was installed.

A generic RIGrunner was mounted in the box to fuse all circuits and terminate a powerpole connections. A fan was mounted on the back of the box to provide forced ventilation with a power switch on the side should you not need the extra flow.



The original Roadcase had two side mounted speakers for a stereo receiver. Both speakers were removed and both grills were left to provide inlet ventilation flow. A third 4 inch speaker was left in the front and plugged into the transceiver aux audio output. A heavy duty DC switch was added to the front of the case to shut off all DC to the box without having to unplug the side mounted powerpole. A rooftop GPS also plugs into the PC front and provides an exact latitude and longitude for Winlink.

The PC HDMI video output was run to an HDMI chassis

connector and a top mounted type A USB chassis connector was installed to provide a spot to plug in a WiFi USB module and antenna. The Logitech K400 keyboard/mousepad is wireless and connects via a small USB dongle. Any HDMI monitor will work for video and audio. I use a 7 inch portable tablet monitor for the car and an optional 15 inch KYY display for any tabletop use. A side mounted UHF feedthrough connector was installed to connect to a 2 meter mag mount antenna.



Tests around the county showed no problem connecting to any of the WA2RES VARA FM digipeaters or the WX2NJ-10 RMS when close enough.

Additionally, the VARA FM program is configured to provide a digipeater function to fill in to a dead area during an emergency, such as a search in a remote area.

Normally for VARA FM operation, no microphone is installed, but the transceiver can be used as a regular voice transceiver on the 2 meter band with 50 watts output max.

Also, at the meeting, N2XW presented John – N2LD, with a 50 year ARRL certificate and pin.

Congratulations John for being an ARRL member for 50 years!

Mike wanted to experiment with composite materials and build a box similar to the commercial IPortable boxes. N2XW wanted his Yaesu FT-991A enclosed and Mike did a fine job! The edges and finish are perfect. Mike is now working on a second box for himself.

On June 21, club members visited the InfoAge Science and Technology Museum in Wall Twp. NJ.




The highlight of the trip was a tour of the Radio Technology Museum. Exhibits and artifacts from the early days of radio featuring equipment used by Marconi were viewed with awe. This venue was the

first transmitting site used by Marconi to demonstrate the feasibility of wireless communication.



From there the experience continued to viewing radio history from the 1920's up to the present day.



Most notable were the advances made in television

and telephone equipment technology.

From this point the members went to the Vintage Computer Exhibit where the birth of the digital age was demonstrated. Early analog computers up to the latest personal computers were on display.





The amazing aspect of this tour was the comparison in size from the early main frames (which occupied an entire room) to the modern data processing machines which can reside on a desk or even be held in your hand.

Our final excursion was to the Model Railroad Museum. There we saw multiple working model train layouts and a working design of a railroad from Jersey City, NJ to Wilkes Barre, PA. This design is being taken from existing structures and from photographs of the past.




