



After a contact has been made, hams often send a QSL card to the other station to confirm the contact. The QSL card contains

information pertinent to the contact which includes the call letters of the station contacted, the date and time of the contact, the signal report, the frequency used and whether the transmission was CW, SSB, RTTY, VIDEO etc. Of course the front of the card contains the station that is sending the card. There is also a place for a friendly comment. QSL cards are used to provide verification of contacts made with different states, countries and the various world zones. With these cards, one can apply for awards such as Worked all States, and DXCC (worked 100 Countries).

If you are a subscriber to the North Jersey DX Association you will receive the QSL cards that come in from foreign countries. To become a subscriber you can send as little as \$10.00 to the DX association with your call letters and address where to send the cards. The NJDXA web site will provide detailed information. See www.njdxa.org.

Rarely will a DX station send a QSL card directly to another station, as the postage costs are high.

If you would like to return a QSL card or send cards to those stations you have contacted you can send them using the US Postal system, however, that is an expensive method. If you belong to the American Radio Relay League (ARRL), you can send cards to them and they will sort and bundle the cards according to country, and send cards to the foreign incoming DX Bureaus.

The requirements are as follows:

- You must be a member of the ARRL
- Include a copy of your QST mailing label
- The cards must be presorted alphabetically by country prefix. Countries with numerical prefixes will be filed last.
- Less than 10 cards in an envelope cost \$2.00, and 11 through 20 cards cost \$3.00. There is also a bulk rate. A personal check or money order is to be used and your call sign is to be included on the check or money order.
