How To Find Repair Info On The Internet

The cutter on our FoodSaver quit working, so I searched the Internet for a replacement cutter assembly. I started at the foodsaver.com/support site, but found that our model wasn't listed. Then I entered "How to replace the cutter in a foodsaver", and found "How to Replace the Cutter Blade in a Food Saver Machine". For \$2, I had it working like new.

Some other examples of finding parts on the Internet:

To tell Google to look for a users manual for a Collins 75A2, enter "manual Collins 75A2". There will be lots of listings. Look through the first 5 or 6, noting the web addresses. Read the ones that have extensions like .edu, .org, and also those ending with .com from legitimate corporations. If you don't find what you need that way, broaden your search to include foreign countries (for example, .ca is Canada). Of course, be sure your virus protection is working.

Many manufacturers have service manuals available, some with complete parts lists.

To find information about a particular component that is still available from Mouser, go to the Mouser search page and click on the link to the maker's spec-sheet.

Ocean County ARES® November News



On Wednesday, October 15th, a general meeting of Ocean County ARES was held and several options for a Simulated Emergency Test (SET) were discussed. We did not participate in the ARRL SNJ SET on October 3rd through 5th because no messages were sent our way and Ocean County was not written into scenario.

It was concluded that to take the place of the SET we would participate in the MARS-ARES Interoperability Exercise on October 27 and 28. The exercise is an effort to develop greater cooperation between the Department of Defense (DOD) sponsored MARS program and the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES). MARS is encouraging its members to discuss communication interoperability in advance of the exercise with their ARES section and district or local Emergency Coordinators.

The exercise calls for MARS members, using their amateur radio callsigns and operating on amateur frequencies, to establish two-way communication with ARES leadership or members in as many US counties as possible by using VHF/UHF simplex or local repeaters or NVIS propagation on HF. The contact can be with any amateur in the county, if an ARES member or leader is not available.

October 27 and 28 is a Monday and Tuesday, so the regular ARES net on Wednesday will not be possible as a contact. There are two preferred windows of opportunity to conduct the exercise, 1201 to 1800 UTC (0801 to 1400 local) on October 27 and 0001 to 0600 UTC (2001 to 0200) on October 28. Note that 2001 start is actually on October 27.

Only one ARES/amateur radio contact per county is needed, but more are okay. I'm asking any available ARES members to monitor the 145.170, WA2RES repeater during the above times and respond to any MARS operators. The information exchange requested is the county name (OCEAN) and the county Federal Information Processing Standards (FIPS) code. For Ocean County this would be $\underline{34029}$.

If contact is made on the repeater, the MARS operator may request to shift to a simplex or HF frequency, if you can accommodate the request.

The contact must be person to person and cannot be via Internet linked repeaters, Internet connectivity systems or store-and-forward email systems, such as Winlink.

Anyone making contact during this exercise is requested to email me with contact details at wx2NJ@comcast.net or send me a radiogram during the October 29 ARES Training Net.
