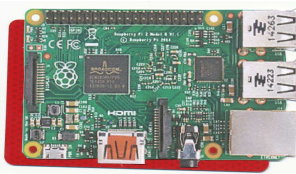

Ocean County ARES® News



April, 2015

We had a very good turnout at the March 18 Ocean County ARES meeting, which was the makeup meeting for February. Holger was able to grab some photos for ID Badges and they will be mailed to those who requested them. Several new ARES members inquired about NBEMS and Fusion capabilities, so future meetings will review the capabilities. I also plan on holding NBEMS training nets at least once a month after the normal voice training net.

The next meeting of Ocean County ARES will be on April 15th, 2015 at the Ocean County EOC, Robert J. Miller Airpark, Berkeley Township. The meeting starts at 7:00 PM. There will be no training net held that evening due to the meeting.

As I'm writing this, it is snowing once again throughout our area. Today is also the first day of spring. It seems like this winter just won't leave and just yesterday the last bit of snow melted in my yard from previous storms. I've had some HF coax cables damaged in my yard by all the wet weather this winter and I'm looking forward in getting them repaired when this snow is finally gone. My plan is to install the new cables in PVC conduit and stop the direct burial routine.

Keith, KC2OON, is continuing to experiment with the D-Star "Ratreflector" program and is utilizing the newest version of the Raspberry Pi computer. He is also exploring linking D-Star and Fusion communications, which is an interesting aspect.

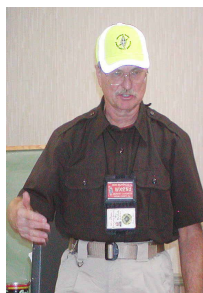
Unfortunately, we are still waiting for the Harvey Cedars D-Star frequency pair from ARCC. It has now been 15 months since the application submittal. If the tank is ready for installation this spring, we may just utilize a temporary frequency pair. Sometimes it's just easier to beg for forgiveness than ask for permission!

Interesting to note in the March 18 ARES E-Letter (which I urge all to read) that Connecticut ARES has exclusively accepted Digital Mobile Radio (DMR) and the Connecticut State Police Amateur Radio Club has installed over 23 UHF linked repeaters around the state and several other clubs have linked their UHF repeaters to the same system. This allows an ARES operator to access the system anywhere in the state with a 4 watt portable DMR transceiver, such as the Connect Systems model CS700, which sells for \$200. It's very impressive to see such cooperation and coordination from all the clubs and agencies involved.

Ocean County Repeaters



Most, if not all, of our local repeaters are open to all radio amateurs. Repeaters are intended for extending the coverage of hand-held and other low power transceivers. Through repeaters with high, efficient antennas, sensitive receivers, automated operation, and 25 to 100 watts of output power, your little hand-held can reach places as far away as Brooklyn. What you need to know to use a specific repeater is the frequency it transmits, the frequency it's listening to, and the sub-audible ("PL") tone that activates it.

As an example, if a repeater listing is:

"146.910 - 127.3 W2DOR o"

1. You should listen for it on 146.910 MHz.
2. "-" means our transceiver should transmit *lower* in frequency. On 2 meters, the frequency difference is normally 600 kHz, on 70cm band, the difference is 5 MHz.
3. You must have a background hum of 127.3 Hz.
4. The repeater will give its I.D. as W2DOR in voice or Morse code at least every 10 minutes of use.
5. The "o", (for "open"), means you don't need special permission to use it.

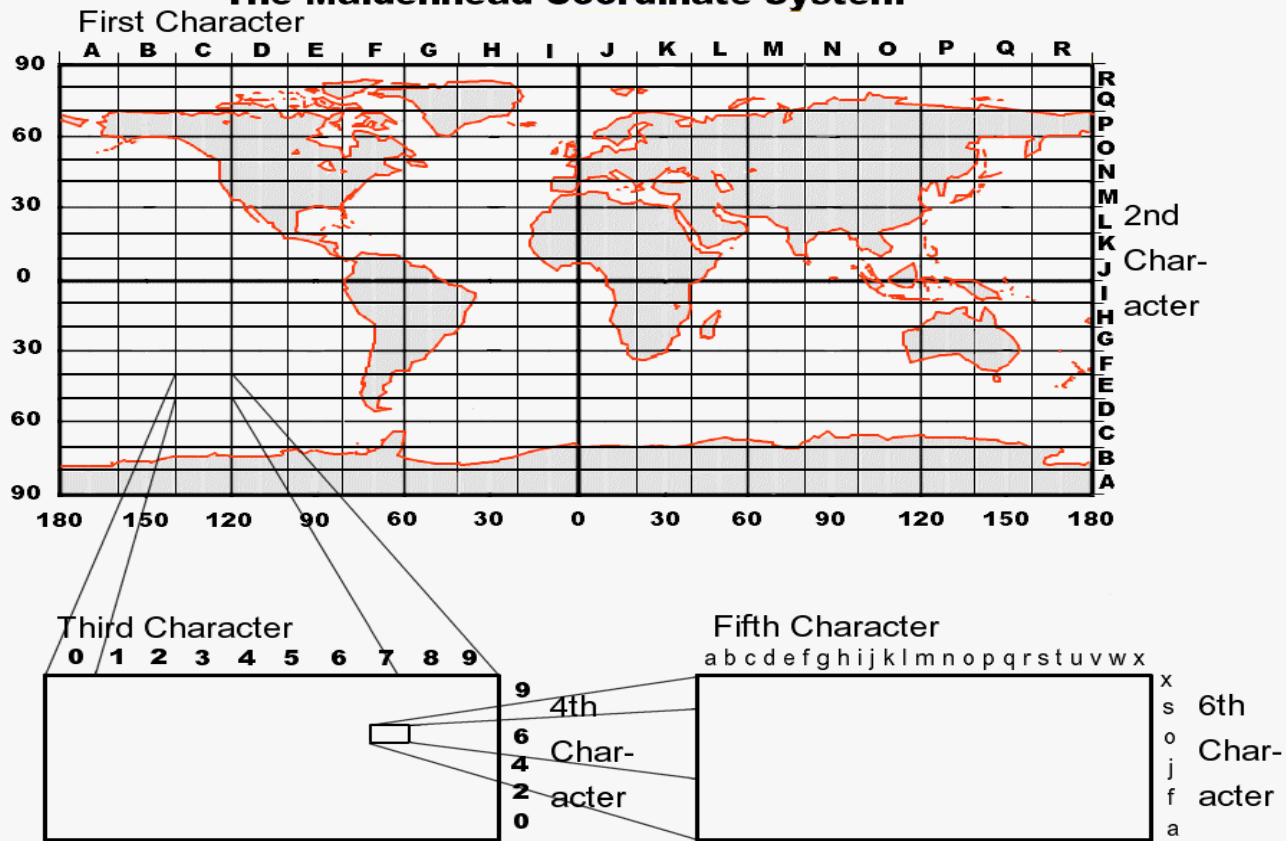
