Club Constitution Change Proposed

A motion has been made and seconded to change the Club Constitution and Bylaws.

The proposed change is to increase the Petty Cash limit to \$150.

It was mentioned that the current \$50 limit means that persons who pick up supplies for refreshments or other minor items sometimes have to be paid by check, which has to be taken to the bank to cash. Also, now that our dues are \$25 a year, dues paid in cash from just two members, plus even one cent already in Petty Cash, would easily exceed the current limit. On the other hand, the use of checks assures a good record of cash flow.

The membership is to vote on the amendment at the August 6 meeting. The increase becomes effective if 2/3 of the members present vote in favor.

Ocean County



ARES® News

- July, 2015

The last meeting of Ocean County ARES was on June 17th at the County EOC. Keith, KC2OON, gave a very nice presentation and color handout of the communication capabilities of Ocean County ARES. Overwhelming comments from those attending wanted increased concentration on Public Service Events, such as walk-a-thons, bike tours, fund raising events, etc. Some requested to be able to work an event every weekend, like many operators in NYC ARES do. In order to be able to coordinate public service events with any kind of consistency, I've taken the action to appoint Keith Yodice, KC2OON, as Assistant Emergency Coordinator – Events. He will be the single contact person for Ocean County ARES public service events.

On Friday, June 19th, a second APRS digipeater was added to Ocean County and assigned the identification TOMRVR. It will operate on 144.390 MHz (simplex), which is the National APRS frequency in the United States. The digipeater components were donated to Ocean County ARES and will be operated under the club callsign WA2RES. This is the same operation of the BARNGT digipeater. Both are located at county towers with UPS/Generator backed power systems, which will be available during any emergency situation, such as Sandy when most were without utility power, but county towers never lost power. These two digipeaters give any ham operators using APRS hardware/software the capability to send/receive messages to other APRS stations and/or Internet users. Additionally, bulletins are available from various agencies such as the National Weather Service, Red Cross, OEM's, etc. APRS was primarily designed to track mobiles, but has evolved into much more. ARES operators at the last meeting also requested message handling training and this will commence with the August 19th meeting. There will be a message handling training overview followed by on-the-air message training in the EOC. This will be accomplished

by operators in different rooms sending/receiving ARRL Radiogram messages via simplex. I ask all ARES operators to please review the message handling procedure and phonetic alphabet per ARRL instructions. These can be found in many places on the ARRL website and in ARRL publications such as "Ham Desktop Reference" and "The ARRL Operating Manual"

Field Day is next week and another request of ARES members is that we conduct our own Field Day starting in 2016. There is a lot to be discussed and planned in this regard and information will be released as it is agreed upon in future meetings. I'm looking for a Field Day Coordinator to volunteer and lead this activity.

The NASA Phonetic Alphabet

The "NASA Alphabet", officially known as the International Spelling Alphabet is the standard radio spelling alphabet of:

- Military services of all 28 NATO members: Albania, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark (Faroe Islands and Greenland included), Estonia, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Spain, Slovakia, Slovenia, Turkey, United Kingdom, and the United States
- The American Radio Relay League (ARRL)
- The International Telecommunications Union (ITU)
- The Federal Communications Commission (FCC)
- The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA)
- The US Coast Guard
- All US railroads
- All maritime communications worldwide
- All international airlines worldwide

The words were carefully selected, about 60 years ago. They had to be reasonably familiar words in all the NATO countries, pronounced substantially the same in all languages, and no two could sound enough alike to be misunderstood. That was quite a challange. "Oboe", for example, could no longer be used for 'O', because the French spell it *Hautbois*, but still pronounce it "oboe".

Police departments seem to prefer their own alphabet, so don't count on it to help if you should have to call 9-1-1.

Anyway, here's the list. Read it aloud several times a day, and you'll remember it, but then practice by "taking dictation" and reading a list of callsigns aloud. It's a lot easier to get good at it than you might expect.

Avoid using any other words as phonetics, these are the ones the operator at the other end is listening to hear. Any other words will defeat the purpose.

Numerals are pronounced pretty much as usual except '4' is stretched to "Fo-wer", and '9' is "Nine-er" so it sounds less like "Five".

Alfa, Bravo, Charlie, Delta, Echo, Foxtrot, Gulf, Hotel, India, Juliet, Kilo ("KEE-lo"), Lima ("LEE-muh"), Mike, November, Oscar, Papa ("Pa-PAH"), Quebec ("Keh-BEK"), Romeo, Sierra, Tango, Uniform, Victor, Whiskey, Xray, Yankee, Zulu.

A Book By Hiram Percy Maxim

The founder of the ARRL, Hiram Percy Maxim wrote a book about his parents, "Genius In The Family".

In 1946, it was made into the movie, "So Goes My Love". It's been on TV at least twice. In Great Britain, it used the original book's title.

The genius, in this case, was his dad, Hiram Stevens Maxim, who invented, among other things, the Maxim Machine Gun.

In response to the fact that machine gun nests were too easy to locate by the repetitive sound, Percy invented the silencer. From that he developed the automobile muffler.

The movie facade of the Maxim home was re-used for the Munster family.


