

Ham Radio Ops To Support Pope Visit

September 22 – 27 and amateur radio will be part of the celebration. Throughout the 6 day event (September 23 0000Z – September 28 0000Z) 6 special event amateur radio stations will be on the air to commemorate the event. Call signs from the Washington, DC area will be K3P and N4P. From New York and New Jersey the call will be K2P. W3FRC/WMF will be on the air from southeastern Pennsylvania and W3P will be on the air in Philadelphia. WM3PEN, also of Philadelphia, will join in Thursday evening at 8 PM EST (Friday 0000 GMT). Four unique QSL cards will be available along with a certificate to mark this special and historic event. A website is being established for QSL and certificate information. Early information and links can be found on the WM3PEN qrz.com website.

The Washington, DC operations are being coordinated by the Jim Nitzberg, WX3B of the Potomac Valley Radio Club (pvrc.org). The southeastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey operations are under the direction of Ron Sigismonti, N3RS of the Frankford Radio Club (gofrc.org). The New York activity is being coordinated by John Melfi, W2HCB of the Great South Bay Amateur Radio Club (gsbarc.org). W3P efforts on the air are being coordinated by Joe Leone, KA3LKM (qrz.com/db/w3p). WM3PEN operations are being coordinated by Bob Josuweit, WA3PZO, and the Holmesburg Amateur Radio Club (harcnet.org).

We are privileged to be able to represent our region of the USA via Amateur Radio. Every three years there is a World Meeting of Families. In 2012 amateur radio operators in Italy had the call II2POPE on the air. This year amateur radio operators in 5 states will be on the air to commemorate the event. This year with the World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia and the second time a Pope has visited Philadelphia, Ron Sigismonti, says having several special event stations on the air by members of a club that originated in Philadelphia, then expanded to encompass the entire region out to 175 miles of Philadelphia; another club whose members will be on the air in the same section of Philadelphia that the Pope is visiting; and another group of Philadelphia operators who are excited about the World Meeting of Families being held in the City will really make this a special event. Additionally, operations from the Greater Washington, D.C. metropolitan area, metropolitan New York City, and parts of New Jersey will encompass the entire region visited by Pope Francis in the United States. It will allow those who can't be in the various cities that he is visiting to participate in this event by talking to those who are. In essence this will be a world family meeting of amateur radio operators.

The Pope arrives at Joint Base Andrews on September 22 and begins his visit in Washington, D.C. with a meeting with President Obama on Wednesday, September 23. He delivers a speech to a joint session of Congress on Thursday, September 24. On Friday he attends a meeting of the United Nations General Assembly in New York and participates in a multi-religious service at the 9/11 Memorial and Museum at the World Trade Center. On Saturday

he gives a speech at Independence Hall in Philadelphia and concludes his visit to the U.S. with an outdoor mass in front of the Philadelphia Museum of Art on Sunday, September 27.

On Wednesday, August 19th, many of us gathered at the Ocean County EOC for our regular meeting of Ocean County ARES. Traffic handling procedures was the topic for the evening and WX2NJ went over the basics of ARRL Radiogram traffic handling. Keith, KC2OON, also demonstrated a low cost setup to enable an operator to interface a computer to a transceiver to be able to transmit/receive digital data, like APRS, using the PC sound card. He showed how \$50 could furnish the transceiver and PC interface and proceeded to demonstrate that it works. Keith will be publishing plans in the near future for his hook up.

Several of the new Fusion polo shirts were also handed out to operators who funded the new DR-1X Fusion repeater, to be located in Toms River. I still have six more shirts to get to operators and several new ARES ID badges. The badges will be mailed via USPS and I will email those who are due shirts to make arrangements.

The question was raised about ARES T-Shirts and we are checking on prices for a design which was produced several years ago.

Hurricane Danny has formed in the Atlantic and has become the first of the 2015 season. It is only a Category 1 hurricane and is expected to lose strength as it moves west. It is a good reminder to all of us that we are still in hurricane season until November and we have the potential to be hit by a devastating storm.

September 20th is the date for the Bike to Build (B2B) bicycle tour fund raiser for Habitat for Humanity. We are still looking for volunteer operators to provide voice communications support for the event. The tour includes three separate routes with the longest being 32 miles and the shortest being 10 miles. All three tours start and finish at Beachwood Bicycles on Route 166 & Starboard Avenue in Beachwood. This year we will be using APRS to track the tail-end of the 32 mile event. Net Control will be positioned next to the bike shop and the WA2RES/R will be used on 145.170 MHz. APRS digipeaters in Toms River and Barnegat will provide adequate coverage to track the event.

Those Tough Exam Questions



The was a time when the back cover of QST would have a full page ad for some newly designed tube, because the majority of ham transmitters were either home-made, or much-modified military surplus. Those days are over, but a ham operator is still expected to know how to test and properly operate a station, and is still authorized to design and construct ham equipment. That's why the exams have to be tough, and one reason ham radio is so fascinating.

Some of the questions on the FCC license exams are easy, but some deserve explanation. That's why it's been suggested that we devote some of our regular meeting time to explaning some of those more puzzling ones. We might begin with a quick verbal quiz from the Tech exam to help determine what to do next. Some hands-on experiences or demonstrations may be used. The idea is to get every member licensed, at least as a Technician, and for all to feel comfortable with the more technical aspects of the hobby.

ARRL VHF Contest Sept 12-14

This is a contest you can enter with any ham rig above 50 MHz, even just a 2-meter hand-held on simplex mode. Call "CQ Contest". Tell your grid code, and write down the time, call sign, and grid code of the station you contact. You score points for each grid you work.

Hint for any ham contest: Don't give all the information the other station needs until you are sure he has at least your callsign correct. Otherwise, he'll go right on to the next station calling.

If you don't know your grid code, look up your call on QRZ.com, and look under the Details tab for your Grid Code.

Have more fun by going mobile, called "rover" class, and work more grids from a mountain top.

Repeaters, calling frequencies such as 146.520, and satellite frequencies are not allowed.


