As of now, WX2NJ will be covering this drill for Ocean County. This should be similar to the last two MARS exercises where a County Status Information Collection Worksheet was requested to be transmitted when requested. The standard worksheet provides the status of the following: Power, Water, Sanitation, Medical Facility, Communications, Transportation and the source of this information.

As was discussed on the 7/20 ARES Nets, a massive heatwave is about to hit our area and continue through Tuesday (7/26). Take appropriate precautions for you and your family and minimize outdoor exposure. Remember to hydrate frequently if you are involved in outdoor activity, even when you think you are not thirsty. I anticipate power failures due to substation overloading, especially on a weekend when most home air conditioners will be operating at maximum capacity.

Using A Super Q Loop Antenna



Dear Elmer,

I bought an MFJ-1788 Super Q Loop Antenna, and hardly hear anything with it.



Dear Friend,

That's not surprising. Here's why:

First of all, the ham bands are in the "summer doldrums", combined with very little sunspot activity.

Second, high Q loops are naturally very quiet, and only respond to frequencies they're tuned to. Tuning is very sharp, especially on the lower bands.

Third, you shouldn't try to use a loop with an antenna tuner.

Fourth, if the antenna is less than 15 or 20 feet from the ground, it should not be mounted horizontally. It's best to mount it upright, and outdoors if possible.

Fifth, here is a bit of a trick to tuning it up. Use an antenna changeover switch to switch from the loop to a less selective antenna, to tune your transceiver to a frequency of interest. Then, switch to the loop and tune the loop. On the lower frequencies, you have to re-tune the loop every time you change frequency.

Sixth, if you want to "work a split", you need to tune the loop to the pile-up, not to the DX station. Hopefully, you'll still be able to hear the DX station.

Finally, when you get it working, you can check the SWR on each band. If it's worse than 2 at frequencies you use, you could try

modifying the position or shape of the inner loop, but never with the power on. These loops can be running at over 2500 volts at 45 amps to put out 100 watts of real power, so even a watt can give a nasty burn.

Let me know how it works out. 73,







Astron VS-20M, 20 amp, regulated power supply.


