Fox Hunt 10:00 AM July 12th

In ham radio, a Fox Hunt is a competition in which the source of a radio signal (the "fox") is "hunted" down by a group of hams using mobile and/or hand-carried antennas and receivers.

The basic rules are quite simple:

- 1. One member sets up a small station ("the fox") at a secret hidden location.
- 2. The frequency, timing, and callsign of the fox is given to a group of "hunters".
- 3. The hunters use maps, receivers, and directional antennas to find the "fox".
- 4. The first hunter to find the fox wins, and maybe gets to be the fox for the next hunt.

Most foxhunts are held on the 2 meter band. The hunters normally work in groups of 2 or 3 persons, hunt independently of the other groups, and normally maintain radio silence.

Hunting equipment can be as simple as a hand-held transceiver held close to the body, but a directional hand-held antenna with a variable attenuator are useful additions.

The techniques learned can be useful in tracking down sources of radio & TV interference, as well as illegal use of radio equipment.


