The Ultimate DX By Urb LeJuene W2DEC

POW! "To the moon Alice." Instead of sending Alice to the moon would you like to bounce radio signals off the moon? We are seeking interested members in starting up a moonbounce group. Interested? Read on.

For those of you who know the joy of working DX are you ready to take it to the next level? How about a propagation path of a half million miles? Maybe you're just interested in the technological aspects of ham radio. Either way you might enjoy exploring moon-bounce.

Earth-Moon-Earth (EME), also called moon-bounce, is arguably the ultimate in DX since the path to the moon and return is a trip of over a half million miles. In the beginning of the art form EME required highly exotic equipment and superior operators on both ends. With the advent of software developed by Princeton's John Taylor, K1JT, it is possible to copy an EME signal 20 DB below the noise level.

WA2ACV, K2SG and I attended a Dayton presentation titled "Moon-bounce on a shoestring." This fascinating subject was the topic of a presentation by Bill ND0B. Bill is quite successfully engaging in moon-bounce with a two meter long john antenna and a couple of hundred watts in addition to K1JT's software.

Would you have any interest in joining a study group to explore what it would take to set up a moon bounce station? The first step would be to receive EME signals and, if successful, to explore establishing a station capable of moonbounce QSOs.



Proto-board Test Unit Dave Ottenberg WA2DJN


I recently went to a ham fest with Larry Puccio and Carl Lee. While we were walking around I stopped at several vender tables and purchased several electronic parts. Among these parts there was a twelve volt one amp small type switching power supply which I purchased for future use.

I also purchased a proto test board which I could use to experiment with some small electronic circuits instead of building the circuits on PC boards.

I had really lucked out in purchasing these items. When I returned home a few hours later, I drew up a circuit with a five volt and nine volt regulator chip and the twelve volt switching supply, this along with the proto board would give me a good experimental setup for playing with solid state electronic circuits. I assembled the parts on a wooden board and now have a working test setup.
