Our Visit with Vince Genzardi 2AEH/W2GRA

On Saturday June 19th a group of club members, Bill Haldane, John Hann, Dave Ottenberg, and myself, traveled to Parsippany New Jersey to visit with our long time club member Vince Genzardi. This was to celebrate his 105th birthday. Vince



was very happy to see us and a table was set in the main dining room where we had lunch with Vince. Two of his dining companions Sam Berger, 92, and Tom Roune, 90, joined us.

Sam was a warehouse manager for NBC broadcasting and maintained a stock of electronic parts while Tom worked at Western Electric as a Product Inspector and at GE as a Product Packing Supervisor. Vince worked in the Fur Business in New Your City and lived in the Pelham section of the Bronx.

Vince was first licensed in 1922 as 2AEH. Two years later the FCC converted all amateur station call letters and he received the W2GRA call that he still has. He told us that he operated 10 and 20 meters, on both AM and CW, and had a big rack mounted transmitter with "800" type tubes in the finals. He still tries to practice with a code practice oscillator and is able to copy at 15 WPM.

Vince enjoyed experimenting with wire antennas and had good success with large loop type antennas. He told us that his best DX was a contact with a Chinese station. He related how the signal was very faint and he just made the contact when it faded out completely. Vince told us about how the FCC shut down all Amateur Radio operation during the war.

He and his wife moved to Fairlawn NJ with his two daughters. There he had a 30 foot tower with a 3 element mini beam and again began to work DX. AM had gone by the way side and he concentrated on SSB operation. He had Heathkit equipment that he built and then a Drake receiver and transmitter combination.

I later learned that on Monday of the following week there was another party for Vince at which the Mayor and town officials were present and the chorus sang songs to the group in attendance.

We are looking forward to being with Vince next year for the 106th Birthday.
