Field Day 2011

This year again we held Field Day and the Toms River Park and we had nine members in attendance; Murray Goldberg KD2IN, John Hann K2JWH, Steve Jackson N2WLH, Warren Keay KC2SSQ, Carl Lee W2PTZ, Dave Ottenberg WA2DJN, Larry Puccio K2QDY, John Roberts KQ4WR and Kevin Wagner W2FA. The fun began around 9:45 AM as we began to set up the three fiberglass masts that would support the two G5RV antennas. The two G5RV antennas were at 32 feet and each was 102 feet long. These antennas were fed with ladder line approximately 62 feet in length. These antennas required the use of balanced tuners but tuned well on 40, 20, 15 and 10 meters.

At the same time Kevin and Steve began to erect the 40 foot aluminum pole that would become an inverted "L" antenna. The horizontal part of the antenna was approximately 150 feet long. At the base of the antenna there were 6 radials at 50 feet each, another 6 radials at 15 feet length and 1 radial at 120 feet. All of these were secured to an aluminum ground plate and served as the ground plane for the inverted "L" configuration. The antenna was tuned remotely by automatic long wire antenna tuner, ICOM AH-2, and the system was fed with a 100 foot length of RG-8 coax cable. The antenna tuned up on 160, 80 and 40 meters.

We finished the antenna installation around 12:00 noon and then dined on pizzas, soda and iced water.

After the lunch break we began adjusting the tuners and testing the antennas. Contacts were made with each of the radios to verify their operability however we did discover one of the tuners had a problem due to loose connections internally. We also fired up the "Little Generator that Could" Everything worked well and as the 2:00 PM start time drew near we were all anticipating an action packed adventure.

Three transmitters were set up and our class was 3A SNJ for Sothern New Jersey. In the four hours we operated we made 342 contacts. This equated to 1234 points with multipliers for emergency power, public place etc.

It was interesting to see some of the fellows watching Steve and Kevin making contacts without either of them speaking into the microphone. On closer examination it was discovered that they had a pre-recorded messages on an MFJ automatic voice responder and it was doing the calling CQ Field day with our club call sign W2HC.

All in all everyone that participated had a good time and we are making plans for next year's event.
