

The Pine Barons Express Road Rally took place on Saturday, November 17th. A total of fifteen hams participated handling communications for the event. Bill, KC2CNB, coordinated all communications for the event and did an excellent job! Thanks to the following operators for volunteering for the event: KC2CNB, N3IE, KC2CRI, N2GEG, N0YMV, AB2IO, WX2NJ, WA2MHA, W2KWI, KC2MTR, KC2LMW, W2BCR, N2RPN, W2KP and WB2GOT.

Four repeaters were used for coverage, Primary – 145.470, KC2QVT/R Chatsworth, Secondary – 147.345, WA3BXW/R Waterford Works, Secondary – 146.700, N2NF/R Tuckerton, and Talk-In/HT Coverage – 145.170, N2IFP/R Manchester. Tactical call signs were used as much as possible to streamline communications and Net Control was rotated between N3IE, KC2CNB and WA2MHA. The Lakehurst Firehouse served as home base for the event with a total of 16 check points being manned by radio operators and scoring teams. Many of the operators played dual roles and served as navigators and



scoring.

The majority of the rally is spent on dirt roads, winding through the woods and cranberry bogs of Ocean and Burlington Counties. Some roads are single lane, requiring four wheel drive for save passage. It's always a challenge to operate ham radio gear in pitch blackness, especially when you have the wrong PL loaded or a cable becomes disconnected and you attempt repairs just as a stream of rally vehicles are approaching your check point.

AARP Endorses Amateur Radio:


